### Tax Breaks for IRA Beneficiaries -See pages 2-3

Einstein was right, and what's more, his statement seems to be truer every time Congress simplifies the tax rules. It's even worse for IRA beneficiaries, who often have little guidance available

#### 60-Day Rollover Relief from IRS

The New Year began with eight new IRA Private Letter Rulings requesting that IRS waive the 60-day rollover requirement and allow more time for IRA owners who had withdrawn from their IRAs but then failed to roll the funds back into an IRA within the required period.

In all cases, IRS ruled favorably, allowing more time to complete the rollover. That's great news for anyone who may have found themselves in this predicament. For details, see "New IRA Rulings From IRS" on pages 4-5.
